TRANSITION / PROGRAM EXIT

Transition Planning Conference (TPC) – Exception Reason

Family did not consent to a Transition Planning Conference Birth to 3 program did not start Transition process in a timely manner

Family did not provide timely consent for a Transition Planning Conference Birth to 3 was unable to schedule the Transition Planning Conference with the school district prior to the 90 day timeline

Child was referred to Birth to 3 after 2 years 9 months of age Child exited the Birth to 3 Program before the Transition Planning Conference was required

Birth to 3 invited the LEA, but they did not attend Child was determined not potentially eligible for services through the LEA

Family was not available for the scheduled Transition Planning Conference

Child turned 3, child referred to LEA, LEA did not find child eligible for early childhood special education services and the child was referred to other programs

Child turned 3, the Birth to 3 Program not refer the child to the LEA because the child was not believed to be eligible for early childhood special education

Child turned 3, child referred to LEA, LEA did not find child eligible for early childhood special education services and the child was **not** referred to other programs

Child did not qualify for Birth to 3 or no evaluation recommended

Child turned 3, child referred to LEA, special education eligibility process was not yet completed

Family chose to discontinue services

Child is no longer in need of services. Successful completion of the IFSP

Parents chose not to enroll or declined next step offered by Birth to 3 Program

Death of child
